Abstract of Program	This project investigates how reading and reflecting on feminist literature can influence student behavior and awareness related to gender, ethics, and equality. Titled "Literature as a Catalyst for Behavioral Change: A Quantitative Study on Ethics, Gender, and Equality" this research-based project engages undergraduate students in guided discussions and peer interviews based on selected feminist texts, followed by a pre/post-intervention survey to track shifts in perception and ethical sensitivity. Students read and analyze texts such as Draupadi, Woman at Point Zero, To Room Nineteen, and The Awakening, and participate in reflective audio-recorded interviews and structured group discussions. They then complete surveys before and after the intervention. The data is analyzed using SPSS to measure behavioral changes in ethical reasoning, inclusiveness, and gender sensitivity. Using accessible tools—mobile phones, free recording software, and student-led transcription—the project integrates literary study with social science methods to measure real change. With a modest budget of BDT 1,00,000, the initiative covers training, volunteer support, data processing, participant honorarium, and the cost of journal publication. The initiative aligns directly with SDG 4 (Quality Education), SDG 5 (Gender Equality), and SDG 16 (Peace and Justice).			
	The results of the project will be shared in a university event and submitted as a research article to a Peer reviewed/Scopus-indexed journal. Over time, the framework can be adapted across departments and scaled for wider educational impact.
